



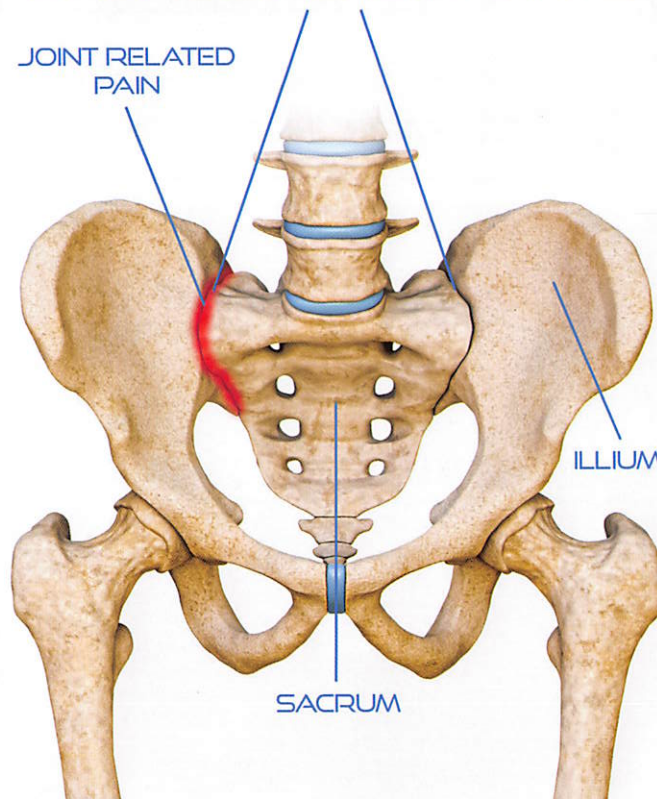
## ABOUT YOUR SI JOINT

The Sacroiliac (SI) joint, located in the lower back, plays a crucial role in connecting the sacrum (the triangular bone at the base of the spine) with the ilium (the uppermost part of the pelvis).

While the SI joint is built to be strong and stable, it can occasionally become a source of discomfort and pain. Various factors such as injury, inflammation, pregnancy, repetitive stress, or degenerative conditions can lead to SI joint dysfunction and result in localized pain.

Individuals experiencing SI joint pain often describe aching or sharp sensations in the lower back, buttocks, or hips, which may sometimes radiate down the leg. In cases of SI disruptions and degenerative sacroiliitis, treatment options including procedures like **INSITE™** may be considered.

## DIAGNOSIS



Diagnosing SI joint pain requires an evaluation from your healthcare provider. You may experience pain on one or both sides of the lower back. The process typically begins with a detailed medical history discussion, where you will have the opportunity to describe your symptoms and any activities or events that may have contributed to the pain.

A physical examination will likely be conducted, during which your healthcare provider may perform specific maneuvers to assess the SI joint's movement and tenderness.

To further confirm the diagnosis, imaging such as an x-ray, MRI, or a CT scan may be ordered to visualize the SI joint and rule out other potential causes of your pain.

## TREATMENT



Traditional SI procedures may use up to 3 large implants with multiple incisions. **INSITE™** uses only **ONE** implant in a minimally invasive procedure, utilizing only **ONE** small incision. It is performed in your doctor's office and was designed with simplicity in mind to help minimize the risks associated with traditional approaches.

The goal is to get you back on your feet quickly to enjoy life. **INSITE™** may help alleviate SI joint pain, restore normal function, and enable you to resume your daily activities with greater comfort and mobility.

Like all procedures, there are potential risks associated with SI joint treatments. **INSITE™** may not be right for everyone. Consult with your healthcare provider to determine if this procedure is right for you.

- Postural changes



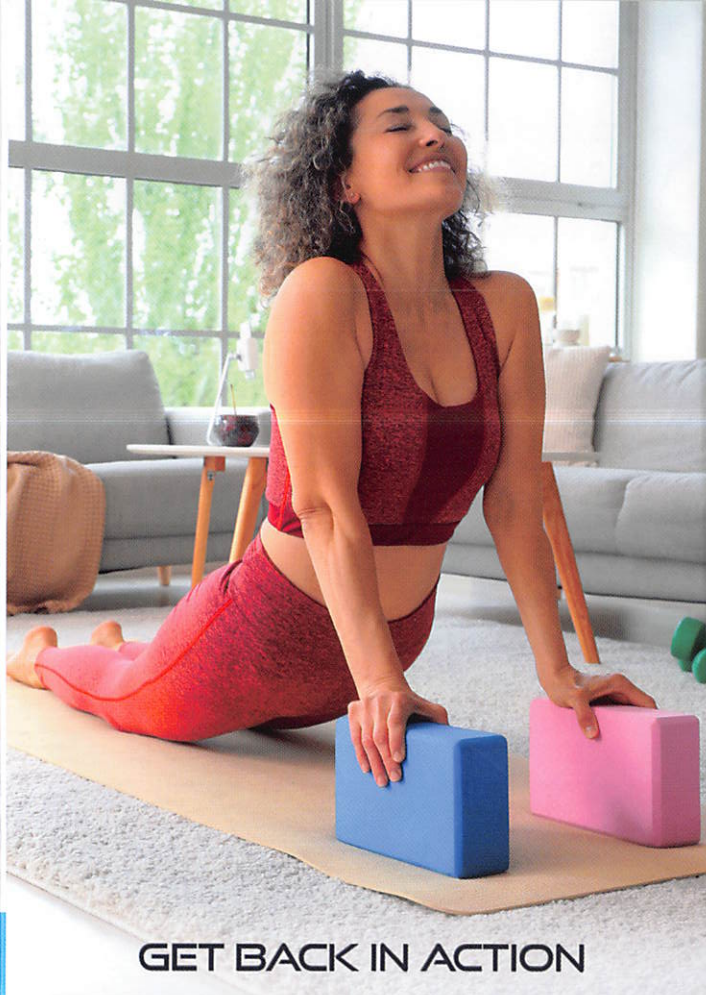


## HOW IS THE INSITE PROCEDURE DIFFERENT?
